located beneath the canopy of walnut trees are most at risk In general, the toxic zone around a mature walnut tree is within 50 to 60 feet of the trunk, but can extend to 80 feet The area affected enlarges outward each year as the tree grows Stems Leaves Nuts and hulls All parts of the black walnut tree produce toxic juglone to varying degrees

The Black Walnut tree contains a substance that is toxic to many plants This chemical, juglone, is present in all parts of the tree and affects plants growing beneath and around the tree Juglone damage appears as yellowing or browning of leaves, stunted growth or failure to grow Damage caused by juglone cannot be reversed
