José Diego María Rivera was born in Guanajuato (Goo-ah-nah-hoo-AH-toh), Mexico, in 1886 He was named "Diego" after his freethinking, journalist father, a criollo (a person of European descent born in Spanish colonial America), and "María," after his mother, who was an obstetrician and a mestizo (part European, part Indian)
