Concert of Europe: lasted from 1815 until the Crimean War of the 1850s Arrangements to guarantee enforcement of the status quo as defined by the Vienna settlement Two major provisions: Quadruple Alliance and the Congress System Embarked on a crusade against the ideas and politics of the dual revolution which lasted until 1848
