Frida Kahlo, *Frida and Diego Rivera*, 1931. A portrait is a picture of a person. A self-portrait is a picture of the artist—him- or herself. Kahlo painted this portrait of herself and her husband, Diego Rivera, to commemorate their visit to San Francisco in 1931. The bird above the two figures holds a banderole, or ribbon, with a Spanish inscription that reads:
