The Hajj of Mansa Musa In 1324, Mansa Musa fulfilled one of the Five Pillars of Islam by making a hajj or pilgrimage to Mecca Musa traveled in grand style from Mali, through Egypt and to the Islamic holy city of Mecca He took with him 12,000 slaves, all dressed in Persian silk He also brought with him 80 to 100 camels loaded with 300 pounds
