- Matisse went to art school but didn't like the realistic way he was being taught to paint He wanted to use bolder and brighter colors He wanted to be more expressive
- His critics named him the "King of the Wild Beasts" because of his expressive artwork He responded by wearing a sheepskin lined coat

Masterpiece: "Beasts of the Sea" by Henri Matisse

- By 1900 Matisse was known as the leader of the Post-Impressionists He was also called an Expressionist Expressionists painted their emotions He was known for his use of bold bright colors His approach in his art had not been seen before
- His critics named him the "King of the Wild Beasts" because of his expressive artwork

Matisse, Morocco represented a kind of earthly paradise He was struck by its strong southern light and bold architecture, which inspired him to flatten and simplify his compositions while employing bold juxtapositions of color The motifs and techniques he developed in Morocco influenced and informed his work for the rest of his career
