The United States Constitution does not explicitly address a right to health care The words “health” or “medical care” do not appear anywhere in the text of the Constitution The provisions in the Constitution indicate that the framers were somewhat more concerned with guaranteeing

Article 1, Section 2 of the United States Constitution

Article 1, Section 2 of the United States Constitution: The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors ...
