baleen whales, toothed whales, and humans capture and eat their food • Toothed whales have cone-shaped or spade-shaped teeth used for catching prey They are carnivores that love to eat fish Their teeth are not used for chewing, only for capturing and holding on to the food • Baleen whales feed by filtering or straining food from the water

Whales remain subject to a multitude of anthro-pogenic threats including acoustic disturbance, ship strikes, habitat degradation, resource competition with humans, climate change and entanglement in fishing gear (Calambokidis & Barlow 2004, Calam-bokidis et al 2008, Reilly et al 2008) Vessel colli-sions with large whales are a growing

toothed whales have teeth which they use to catch their slippery marine prey Toothed whales also have a single blow hole Dolphins, porpoises, killer whales and sperm whales are all members of this group Most of the whales that visit New York's waters are baleen whales They are generally larger than toothed whales and have two blowholes

### **Change in singing behavior of humpback whales caused by ...**

Male humpback whales produce a "song" that is a complex vocal ses- sion composed of multiple sounds named "units"; a series of units is called a "phrase" and a sequence of phrases is called a "theme" in the breeding season [26-28]

### **Satellite-monitored movements of humpback whales ...**

whales (7 females and 4 males) were instrumented with satellite transmitters off Brazil (ca 18°30'S, 39°30'W) to investigate their movements and migratory destinations Mean tracking time for the whales was 396 d (range = 5 to 205 d) and mean distance travelled was 1673 km per whale (range = ...
