In "Woman Hollering Creek" the reader is presented with a pitiful character found in a miserable situation, which she cannot escape, and the reader is called to empathize with her The protagonist, Cleófilas, is a Mexican woman who is tricked into marrying a man who lives on the other side of the border, who is believed to have a good job
